

Rules and Regulations

- 1 All owners are responsible for their own dog and **must have adequate Public Liability Insurance**
- 2 **All dogs entered must be 6 months old or over**
- 3 Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times (Except when instructed otherwise by the judges).
- 4 Any Dog being aggressive to other dogs or the Judge and Stewards will be asked to leave the ring.
- 5 Children under the age of 5 years old are not permitted in the ring
- 6 Owners are responsible for clearing up after their dogs.
- 7 This is a Charity Event - So no refunds will be given.
- 8 The Judge's decision is final.
- 9 No CC, Reserve CC or Junior Warrant winners may enter the Pedigree Classes
- 10 Should the event be cancelled because of Covid restrictions the fees of those who have pre-registered are eligible for a refund.

Kennel Club Good Citizen Award - Bronze Level

Ring opens at 12:00 and entry is £5



The Kennel Club Good Citizen Dog Scheme Bronze Award is given to a dog that will walk and behave in a controlled manner on the lead, will stay in one position on command, will allow its owner to clean, groom and inspect it.

Any dog can be entered providing it can be demonstrated it has been microchipped and that the name and the address of the owner is on the collar or disc. In addition, the handlers must show that they have means of cleaning up after their dog.

The following must be demonstrated

- The collar and lead can be put on the dog without hassle
- The dog will walk on lead without distractions or pulling.
- The dog will wait while the handler opens and proceeds through a gate/door. Then come through when called
- The dog is not distracted whilst walking amongst people. Also, the dog behaves in a quiet, relaxed manner whilst the handler holds a conversation for one minute.
- The dog will stay on the spot while the handler moves five paces away but in sight for one minute.
- The handler is able to groom all parts of the dog whilst on a lead without a struggle. Handlers are required to provide their own grooming equipment.
- The Dog allows inspection of its body by its handler. (mouth, teeth, throat, eyes, ears, stomach, tail and feet)
- The dog is released from its lead, and the handler moves 10 paces away. When directed to do so, the handler calls the dog and when rejoined, the dog should stop close to the handler.
- The knowledge of the handler on specific subjects relating to owning a dog.

A Certificate will be awarded when the required standard has been achieved on all the above

Scurry



This is a fun event where the dog is held at the start of a narrow fenced lane and the owner walks to the far end and calls the dog. The dog's time is measured over a course of 5 straw bales. There is no limit to the number of times you can enter. The shortest time recorded wins a rosette - it's surprising but dogs with short legs often win!
